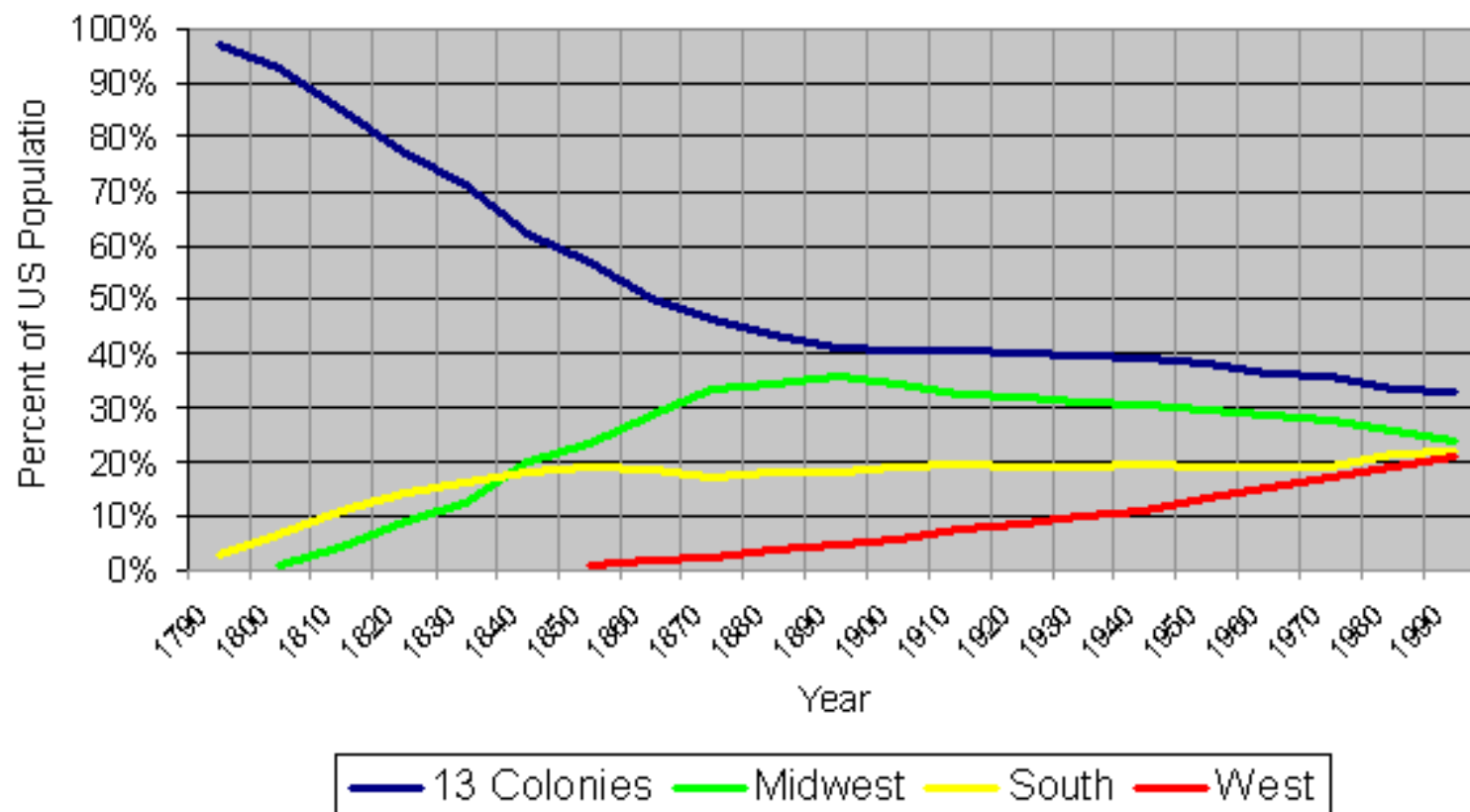

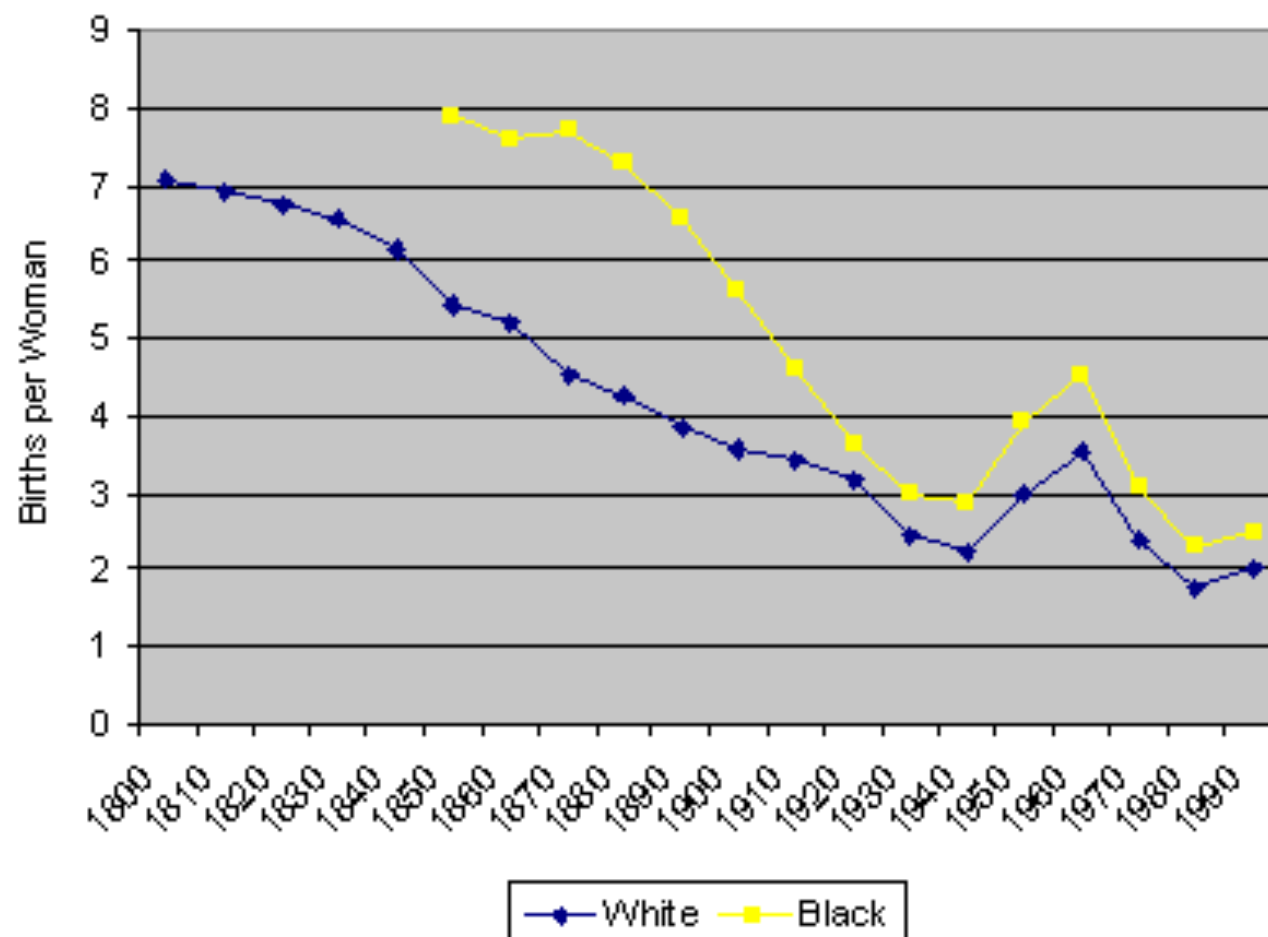
U.S. Population 1790-1830 and increase from previous decade

1830	12,866,020	25%

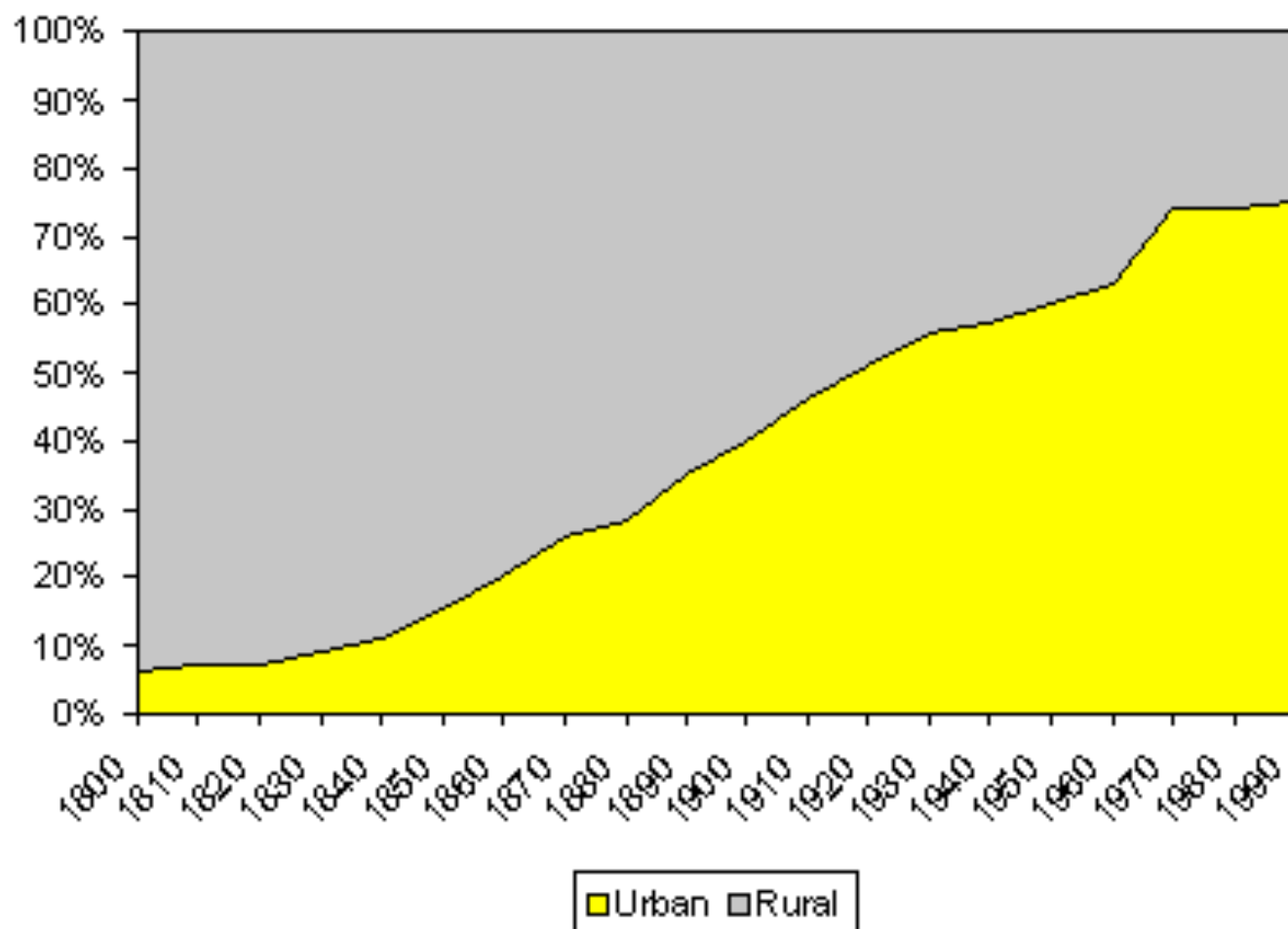
US Population by Region, 1790-1990



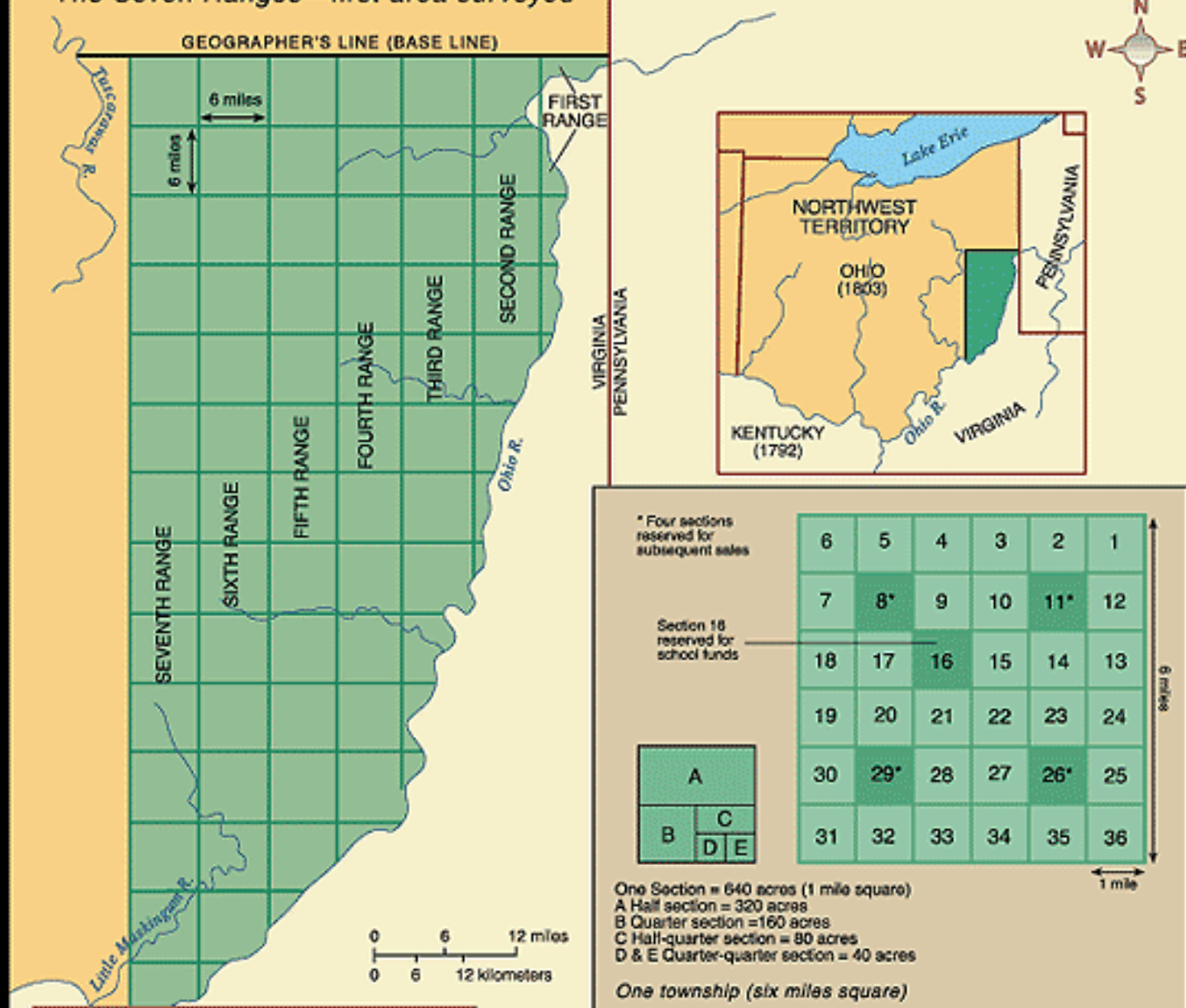
Total Fertility Rate, 1800-1990



Changes in Rural/Urban Population, 1800-1990

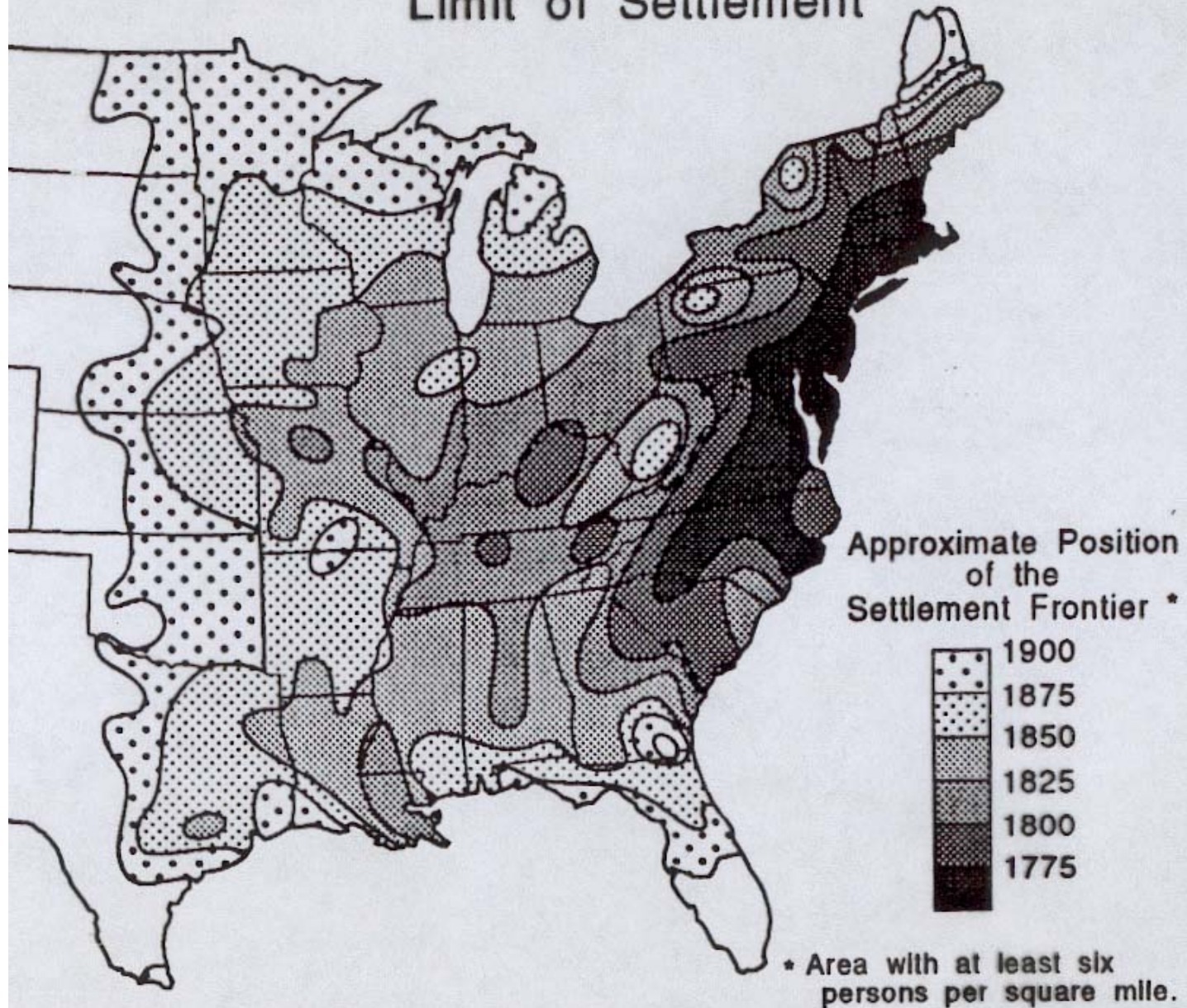


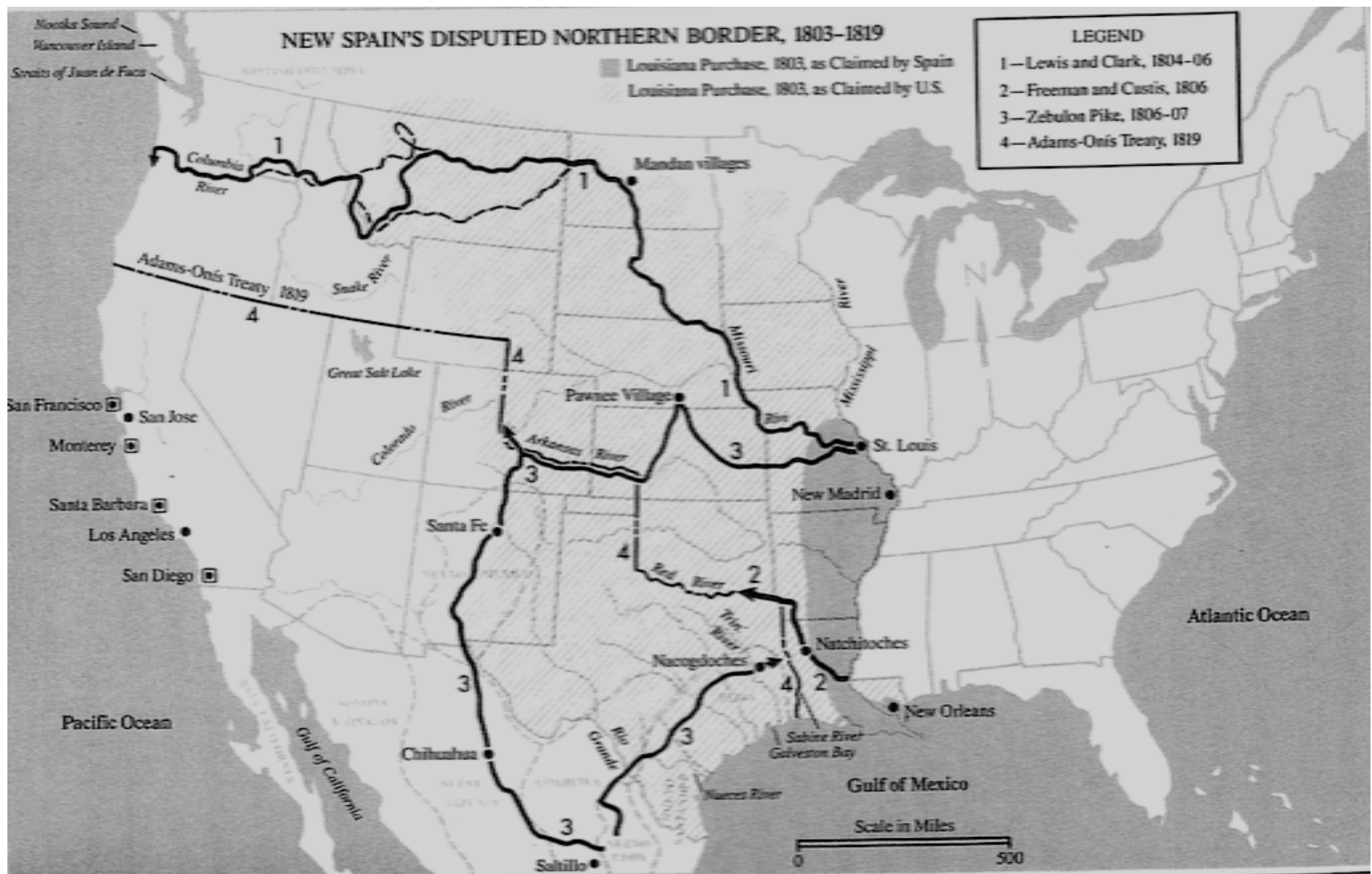
The Seven Ranges—first area surveyed



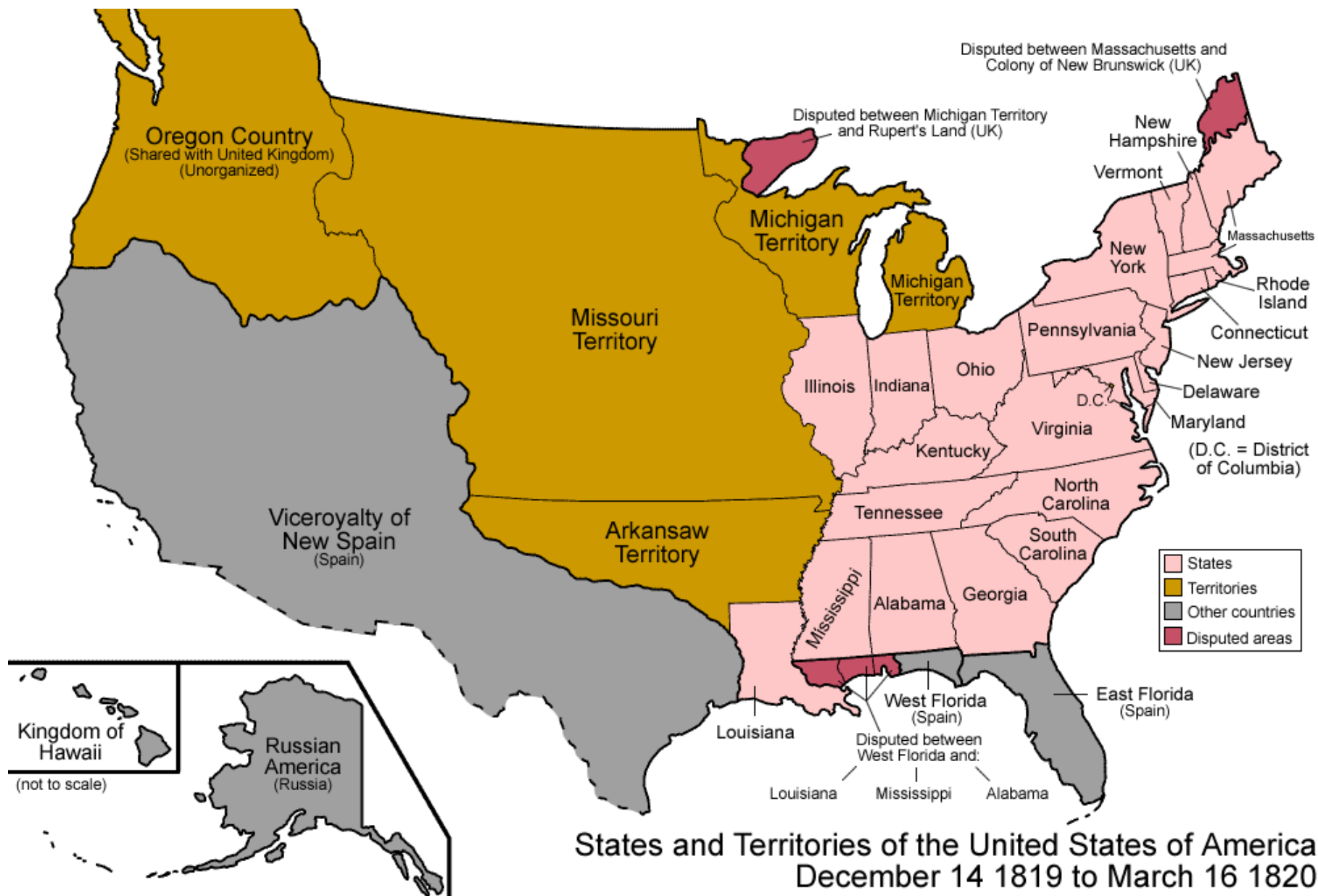
Land Ordinance of 1785

from Weber, *The Spanish Frontier in North America*



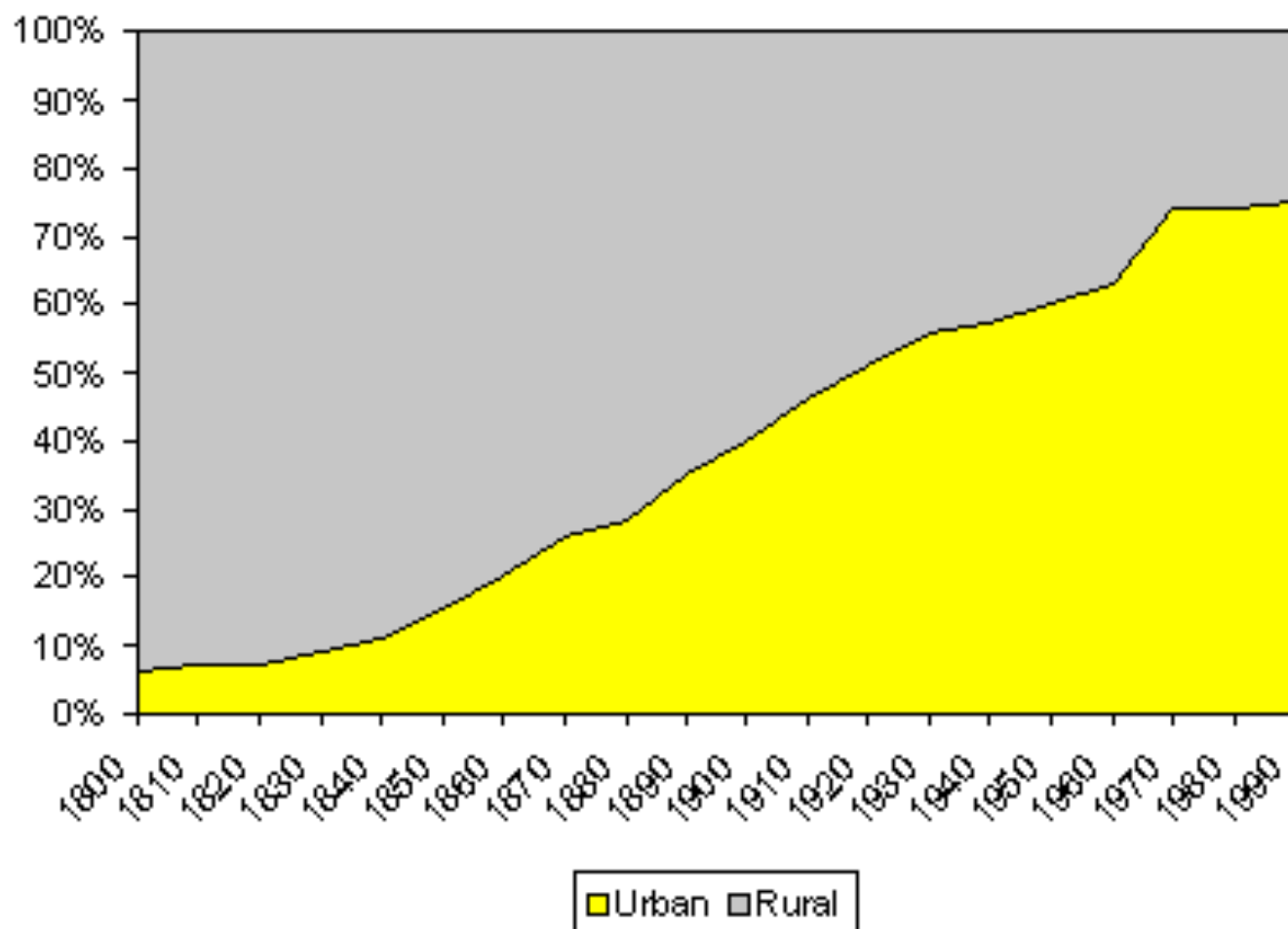


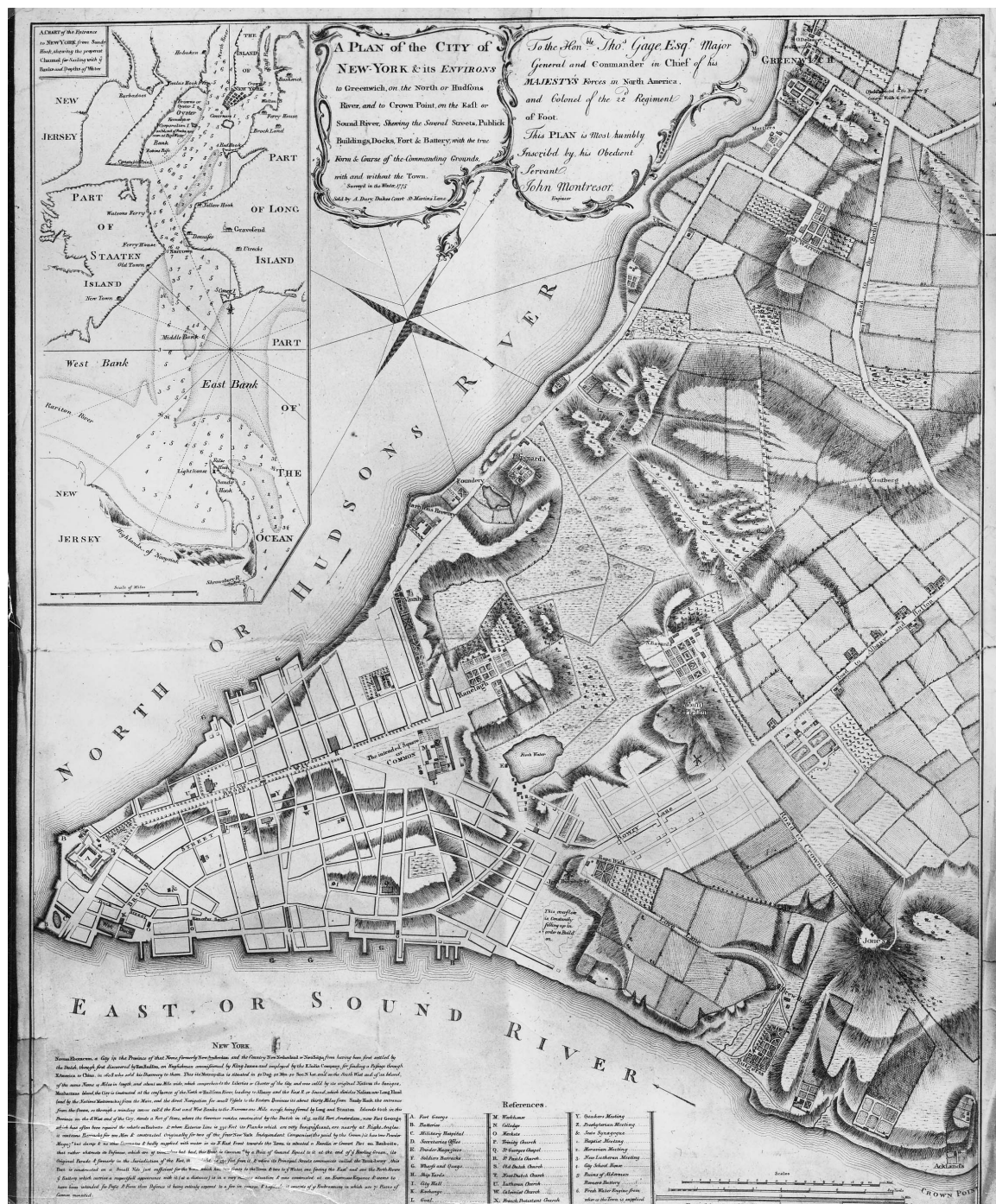

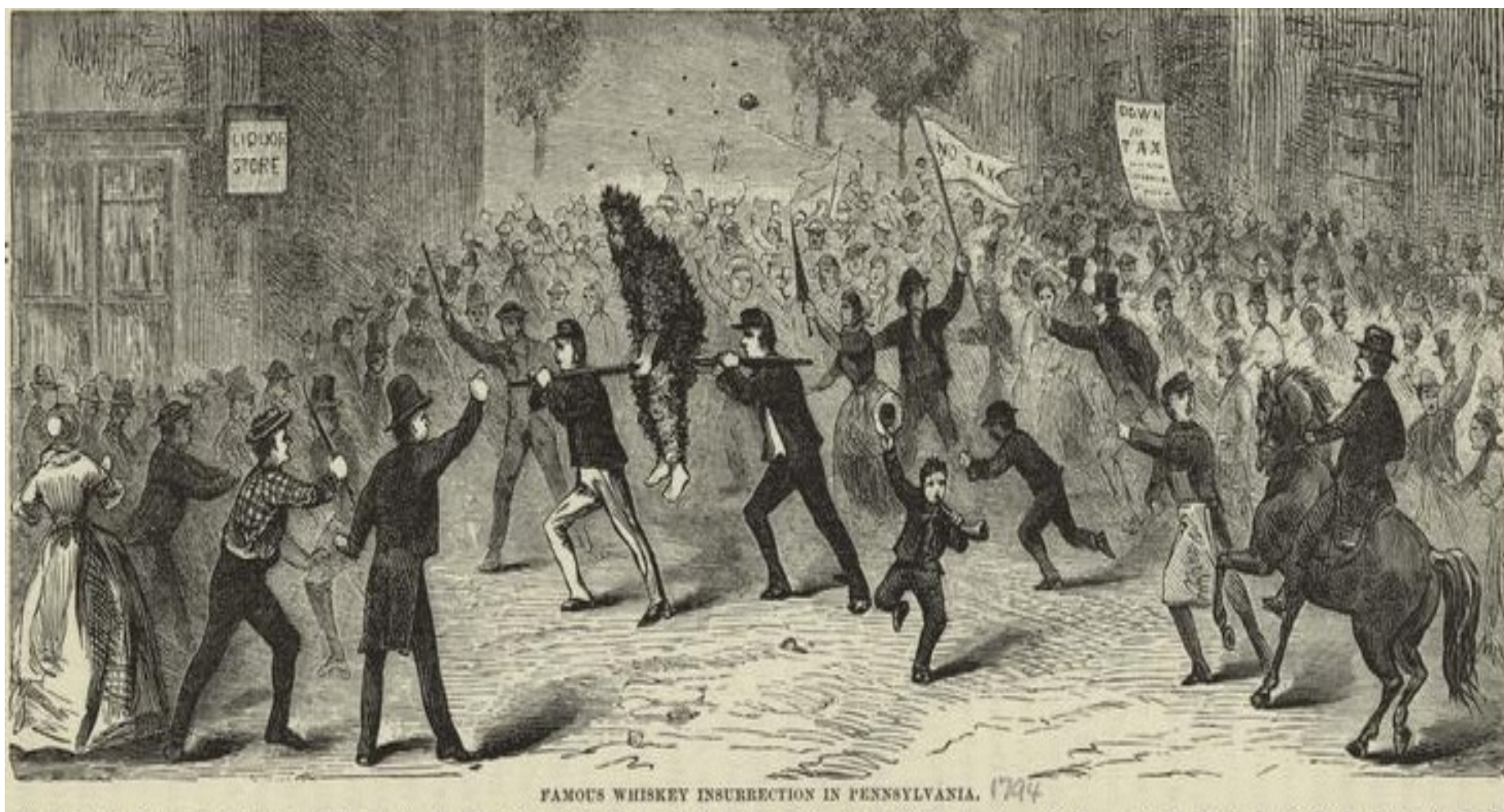
